
'To create a knowledge base of Irish and international research on the occurrence, prevalence, detection and response to the abuse of older people'





Study Objectives

- Prevalence of overall abuse & individual types of abuse in the previous twelve months, perpetrated by people in a position of trust and the wider community, and strangers
- Prevalence of overall and individual types of abuse since the age of 65 years perpetrated by people in a position of trust and the wider community.
- Risk profile of older people who experience mistreatment
- Profile of perpetrators
- Impact & responses



Methodology

- Face-to-face interviews with 2,021 older people
- All interviews were conducted in private
- Total household calls n=5658
- 83% response rate
- Questionnaire examined:
 - Socio-demographics
 - Social support
 - Health and functional status
 - Incidences of financial, physical, psychological and sexual abuse, and neglect
 - Impact and reporting of mistreatment
 - Perpetrator characteristics

Main Findings

- Prevalence of mistreatment in previous 12 months was 2.2 % or 10,201 older people
- Types of mistreatment

- Psychological abuse 1.2%
- Physical abuse 0.5%
- Neglect 0.3%
- Sexual abuse 0.05%
- Prevalence of mistreatment since 65 years of age was 4% or 18,764 older people

Managing elder abuse in Ireland: The Senior Case Worker's experience

Aim and Objectives

- To examine the Senior Case Workers' experiences in managing cases of elder abuse
- To examine the challenges and dilemmas faced by Senior Case Workers in managing cases of elder abuse and how these are overcome.
- To identify good practice in the management of elder abuse cases, as perceived by the Senior Case Workers.
- To identify priorities for future service development

Approach

- Extensive literature review
 - 1. Prevention, identification and management of elder abuse
 - 2. Responses to elder abuse internationally
- Face-to-face interviews with Senior Case Workers

Older people's experiences of mistreatment and abuse

Aim and Objectives

- To increase knowledge and understanding of abuse and mistreatment as experienced by older people in Ireland
- To examine the extent and impact of abuse on older people and on their families
- To examine the decision-making pathways and forms of action taken by older people in response to the abuse.
- To explore the coping strategies older people adopt to deal with the abuse.
- To identify the support needs of older people who have experienced abuse.

Approach

- Comprehensive literature review
- Feasibility study
- In-depth interviews with older people who have experienced abuse
- Recruitment through the Senior Case Workers

Survey of staff-resident interactions and conflicts in residential care settings for older people

NCPOP

NATIONAL CENTRE FOR THE PROTECTION OF OLDER PEOPLE (NCPOP)

Aim

 To obtain a baseline measurement of the extent of the problem of mistreatment and neglect in residential care settings as reported by nursing and care staff

Objectives

- To measure the extent to which nursing and care staff working in residential care settings for older people:
 - Experience conflict with residents
 - Observe potentially neglectful or abusive behaviours towards residents.

Approach

- Sample of residential care settings
- Nursing and care staff
- Survey approach
- Anonymous self-completed questionnaire


